DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story building two bays wide, the left bay is narrower than the right. The third story front is a steeply sloping slate mansard roof. The main roof on the building slopes slightly to the rear. The first story front is faced with brownstone and the second story and remainder of the building is built of red brick laid in common header bond.

The left bay at the first floor contains a doorway with double doors and has a transom in a semi-circular arch above it. The arch has brownstone voussoirs and key-stone. To the right of this doorway is a wood and glass storefront with the entrance between two divided display windows. There are transoms over the door and windows. Under each window is a brick planter.

At the second floor, the left bay has a double hung window with 1/1 sash and a concrete sill. Over it is a semi-circular arch with voussoirs beveled on the inside. On the right hand side of the facade is a three-sided wood bay. The windows are double hung with 1/1 sash and have semi-circular arched heads. There are panels below and above the windows; those above each window are divided and have a rosette between halves. Between the second and third stories, an entablature with paneled frieze extends across the facade forming the lower edge of the mansard roof to the left bay.

In the right bay at the third story is a three-sided balcony carried up from the bay below. This has modified Tuscan columns at its corners and elliptical arches over each opening. Between columns is a wood railing. Above the arches is a denticulated cornice and beside them are engraved panels. Over the cornice is a slate ogee turret roof topped by a metal finial. The left hand bay at the third story is a pediment headed dormer containing a double hung window with 13/1 sash; the top sash has a large square in the center with a border of twelve smaller panes. Between the bays is a diamond of red slate on the roof and on the bays' outsides are red slate Stars of David. At the roof's top edge is a cornice with dentils.

On its south elevation, the building is five bays wide. The first story windows have been closed and those on the second and third floors are double hung with 2/2 sash and segmented arches at their heads, except for the second bay from the right at the third story which has no window and the first bay from the right at the same story which has a circular window. At the top of this wall are two chimneys spaced at the third points of the wall.
