DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick building detached on the left side. It is five bays wide and two bays in depth with a newer two story brick "L" shaped wing one bay wide and two bays deep (~~addition is~~ on #308) with a side balcony. All brickwork is of painted common bond. There are shop entrances on the first and fourth bays from the left with an entrance to the second story apartments in the center bay. The shop doors are of glass and in pairs with large plate glass show windows framed by moulded or fluted panels. They have separate moulded cornices bracketed on the ends. The central door is of glass and wood panels with a four pane overlight. Second story front windows are now of 1/1 sash except for a smaller window in the center of 3/1 sash and all are framed by louvered shutters. Because of many coats of paint, it is impossible to check the window heads, but they may be brick (flat) arches. Rear windows are of 6/6 panes with segmental brick arches and side windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The front, steep slope 'A' frame and the wing shed roofs are both of metal. Wide enclosed chimneys rise from both endwalls. The attic is lighted by two 6/6 sash peaked dormers on the rear and by two 6/6 sash peaked dormers with round arched windows on the front. The front and rear roof cornices are of the moulded box type. The foundation height apparently varies between the two shops. The front facade has a Colonial watertable and a three string brick belt course at the second story level. The latter remains only on the #306 side of the building.
