DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story (three stories in rear) brick attached building, approximately four bays square with a two story "L" shaped wing one bay wide and two bays in depth. There is a third floor rear balcony and another on the end of the wing. There are several newer one story additions. All brickwork is of common bond, the front being painted. A shop doorway occupies the second bay from the left and the entrance to the upper floors lies in the fourth bay from the left. The large pane shop windows in the first and third bays and both entrances are unified by pilasters with raised moulding and with a moulded cornice over all, supported by brackets separating the bays. Second story front windows are of 6/6 sash with wood sills and hooded moulded cornices. Windows on the rear of the front section are 2/1 sash and the wing has 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. This two story building has very high front second story windows, the roofline is the same as the three story adjoining building (#310, 12) and the bracketed moulded cornice continues across both buildings. The front section roof is rather flat and the wing has a metal shed roof. There are several small chimneys. The building rests on a rather low foundation.
