DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story Colonial brick attached house and shop. It is three bays square with a two story "L" shaped wing one bay wide and six bays deep with a long side balcony. Front brickwork is of painted Flemish bond and the rear area is laid in common bond. One wall of the first story of the wing is built of fieldstone. (on the right side). The main entranceway on the front elevation occupies the left bay, has a deep paneled embrasure, contains a single door, is framed by fluted pilasters, and headed by an entablature with an unusual protrusion and supported by ornately carved consoles. An enclosed gateway to the rear yard with a round arch of header bricks lies just to the left. A modern shopfront with a simple moulded cornice lies to the right. Second floor front windows are of 6/6 sash with wood sills and flat brick arches of early type long shaped voussoirs. A bricked-in window with the same type arch lies over the enclosed gateway with the left side against the property line.??? Rear windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. Rear doors are paneled under glass. The front section is covered by a metal moderate slope "A" frame roof with a wide enclosed chimney rising from the right wall. The wing has a slight slope metal shed roof. The front roofline has a simple moulded cornice with Georgian style shaped modillions. The building lies on a low fieldstone foundation.
