DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick attached townhouse, three bays wide and two bays in depth, with an "L" shaped wing being one bay wide and four bays long with a side balcony. Balcony posts are octagonal in shape and tapered. Front brickwork is of painted Flemish bond and rear brickwork is laid in common bond. The entrance lies in the right bay. It is of Colonial-Federal style with a large six paneled door with sidelights separated by Doric columns. There is a three part overlight with oval glass panes in the ends. Heading the doorway is a grooved wooden lintel with wood blocks carved with roundels on the ends and over the sidelight divisions. Lintels over the front windows are similar in design except for having end blocks in the center. The doorway has a paneled soffit and embrasure as do those around the paneled doors on the rear. Brass fittings and a set of two marble steps with iron railings enhance the entranceway. All front windows are of 6/6 sash with wooden sills and lintels. Some of the sash is of old handblown glass. There is a colonial style JIB window-door on the rear of the front section. Rear doors are of the old six panel type with four pane overlights. The front section roof is a steep metal "A" frame type with end roof curtains and end buttresses. Wide enclosed chimneys rise above each gable. The roof is supported by three string brick cornices on the front and rear sides. This house rests on a fairly low fieldstone foundation. The wing has a metal shed roof.

Front elevation paint is of many layers and could be greatly improved by scraping to show the old brickwork in Flemish bond.
