2. DESCRIPTION OF PHYSICAL APPEARANCE:

415-417 North Market is a three story four bay wide commercial building. The facade of the building is finished in a face brick laid in common bond. Although the first floor commercial area of the building was substantially altered in the 1960's, the remainder of the building retains its 1870's character. (continued, other side)

2. Description (continued)

Of particular importance is the decorative wood architraved hood moldings supported by brackets over each window, original twin door paneled entrance with fanlight transom and decorative dentiled and bracketed hood. A heavy dentiled bracketed cornice with pierced paneled frieze dominates the roofline of the building. A two story brick addition extends in an ell to the rear of the building. A two story open porch extends along the south side of the building.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a high, three story brick detached building, four short bays wide and four long bays in depth with a two story "L" shaped wing approximately five bays long and two bays wide with a side balcony. All brickwork is of common bond and it was evidently built originally as a three story building judging by exposed side brickwork. The main entrance (to upper stories) occupies the right bay with a rather ornate doorway. The double front doors are paneled and headed by a large pane round arch transom with a moulded transom bar. Plain pilasters frame the doorway and are topped by long consoles with a square block trim which supports a flat moulded entablature with rows of dentils. The spandrells of the arch around the transom have trim of incised scroll designs and a decorative keystone surmounts it. The vestibule has three steps leading to the inside pair of doors with round arched panes over panels and also headed by a round arched transom. The entranceway is approached by a "stoop" of two granite steps with sidewalls supporting full-sized, mid 19th century cast iron figures of lions "couchant" (resting). The other bays to the left are occupied by a rather ugly composition and metal shopfront which detracts from the building. Second and third story windows on the front are of 2/2 sash with segmental arches covered by hooded flat entablatures which are moulded and supported by fluted consoles with incised scroll designs. Rear windows are mostly of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. Rear area doors are paneled and contain overlights. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a shed roof, both of metal. There are several small enclosed chimneys on the sidewalls. The front facade is topped by a Victorian cornice trimmed somewhat similarly to the doorway. Fluted consoles divide and end the bay sections. There is a row of shaped modillions, the frieze is topped by a row of moulded dentils like over the doorway, raised panels of incised designs lie between the consoles, and it is ended by a row of raised moulded lozenges. The building rests on a rather low fieldstone foundation. The rear area and wing side of the building contains a tree shaded yard and large trumpet vine climbing up to the balcony and could be made into an outdoor dining area for the restaurant in front.
