

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick attached residence being three bays wide and two bays deep with a 2-1/2 "L" shaped wing four bays long with a side balcony. All brickwork is of unpainted common bond. The front doorway occupies the right bay and has a glass over panels door with a rectangular transom and moulded transom bar. The doorway soffit and frame are paneled. A large triple window of 1/1 sash lies to the left with mullions moulded at the top and base. This is headed by a segmental two row header arch with long voussoirs forming a keystone, the same as over the doorway but the other windows are headed by round arches. Second story windows are also of 1/1 sash. The infills are decorated by an incised diagonal and counter diagonal  pattern, unusual in this area. An enclosed doorway to the rear yard lies to the right of the front door and contains a board and batten gate with a high decorative panel above with cut-out, long vertical, oval designs. Rear windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The "A" framed roofs are of moderate slope and covered with asbestos shingles. The last bay of the wing has a metal shed roof. An unusual single square chimney rises from the center of the front section roof. The front of the roofline rests on a three string brick cornice. The building sets on a low fieldstone foundation. There is a long flower yard to the rear.
