DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story attached ^{brick} building being four bays wide and two bays in depth with an "L" shaped, two story wing, one bay wide and four bays long with a side balcony and a one story, 1-1/2 bay extension. The second story of this building extends over the left property line and passageway to the rear of #428 on the left side by 1/2 bay according to the vertical joint. The entire front facade has been refaced and now contains an attractive shopfront in the three right bays. This has a recessed doorway to the shop and apartment above, large pane windows with panels beneath, and a boxed cornice with an awning. To the left is a double enclosed passageway to the rear yards with board and batten gates and rectangular panels above with a wooden grill of a very attractive cut-out design, the same as used at #424. Even though the left passageway leads to #428, the whole area is open and long heavy beams support the second story of #426. Second story front windows are modern 1/1 sash with soldier course lintels and sills. Rear windows are of old 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. There is an old Colonial style JIB window-door on the rear of the front section and other doors are of six panels with overlights. The roof of the front section is of moderate slope "A" frame with asphalt shingles and a double flue enclosed chimney rises from the right wall. The wing has a steep metal shed roof. A three string brick cornice supports the front and rear rooflines but has been "brick over" on the front. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation. A long narrow flower yard extends to the rear.
