
DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a complex of three buildings presently used as warehouses. #2 had originally been a livery stable and #1 was probably used as the office and carriage house as the east end faced an alleyway to the street. #3 probably was a latter addition.

#1 is a 1-1/2 story brick detached rectangular building in common bond brickwork, three bays wide and four bays in depth. The structure is lighted by 6/6 windows with wood lintels and sills in the west end and unusual 6/6 peaked dormers set halfway into the wall and halfway into the gable roof on the north side. The moderate slope "A" frame roof is now sheathed with metal over 1' boards. The foundation is not noticeable.

The #2 stable section extending to the south from #1 is of two stories on the East to one story on the West with a shed roof. This is of frame construction, covered by embossed metal siding in a brick pattern and is three bays wide and five bays long with a lower three bay long extension. It is lighted by a row of nine pane windows just under the roof on the East side. It rests on a fieldstone foundation.

The #3 section juts from the East end of #1, is of two stories, one bay wide and three deep and covered with German siding. It is now shored up at the base with cement blocks.
