DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick attached house being three bays wide and two bays in depth with a two story "L" shaped wing, one bay wide and five bays deep with a side balcony and a section of one story dependencies extending to the rear. Front brickwork is of mixed hues of brick and laid in Flemish bond, recently cleaned and rear brickwork is salmon colored and laid in common bond. The left bay of the front section was added at a slightly later date, according to a vertical joint, and now contains the entranceway. This consists of a wide, six paneled door trimmed with brass hardware, a transom with a moulded transom bar, and a paneled soffit and frame. This is approached by a low porch with a wrought iron railing. All front windows are of 6/6 sash with louvered shutters. First floor windows are higher than those on the second floor and contain jack arches (flat) and the second floor arches are of the old flat brick type. Rear area windows are 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills with paneled shutters on the first floor and louvered shutters on the second. Rear doors are of six panels and have overlights. The front section roof is of moderate slope "A" frame with an enclosed chimney rising from the right gable and the wing has a shed roof. Both are covered by asphalt shingles. The rooflines are supported by a three string brick cornice on the front and rear, but the front is decorated by a sawtooth pattern in the middle course. This house rests on a low foundation of fieldstone. There is a flower yard to the rear.
