DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached pair of houses, apparently built for two related families judging by the front brickwork. There are continuous floorboards across the building and a covered-over doorway between the two on the second floor. It is four bays wide and two bays in depth with two story "T" shaped wings added at a later date. These are four bays deep and one bay wide with rear balconies, #508 being enclosed. All brickwork is in common bond and the front facade has recently been sandblasted and has a very nice texture. Front entranceways occupy the inner bays and contain six panel doors with brass fittings and without overlights. These are headed by segmental, two row header brick arches with paneled infills containing carved roundels in the center. The soffits and door frames are paneled. These entrances are approached by four step porches with wrought iron railings. On either side are rather large round arched windows of 1/1 sash and are topped by three row header brick arches. On the second story, two bays of #508 contain a 20th Century bay window, but #510 contains the original windows, now of 1/1 sash, wood lintels and sills, and louvered shutters. Rear windows are of 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills. The rear doors are paneled and without overlights. The front section has a metal, moderate slope "A" frame roof with enclosed chimneys rising from the gables. The attics are lighted by small four paned windows in the gables. The wings are covered by slight slope metal shed roofs. The rooflines of the front section are supported by three string brick cornices. The building rests on a high fieldstone foundation. To the rear are small dooryard gardens.
