DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story stone and brick building containing two homes and detached on the left side by a lawn area. It is four bays wide and three bays in depth with added two story "U" shaped brick wings being one bay wide and three bays in depth and with rear balconies. Front walls have been replaced by brick of a nice shade of red with #513 being painted and #515 recently sandblasted. The entrances lie in the inner bays and contain paneled doors with overlights and transom bars trimmed with small dentils. These are headed by segmental three string header arches, as are all front windows (of 1/1 sash). Rear area windows are 6/6 sash with segmental two row header arches as over the rear doors. The front section roof is of a steep slope, metal "A" frame with chimneys rising from behind the side stone walls. The attic of #513 is lighted by an old six pane sash in the left gable. The wings have slight slope metal shed roofs. Front and rear cornices are boxed. These homes rest on rather high stone foundations. Brickwork is of common bond. #513 is fronted by a herringbone pattern brick sidewalk. There are long flower yards to the rear.
