**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a wide 2-1/2 story brick building containing two homes and is detached on the right side. It is six bays wide and three bays in depth with "U" shaped, two story wings, two bays wide and five bays long, which were added at a later date. These wings have inner side balconies, and judging by the overhang of the rear roof of the front section, there had been a balcony there. All brickwork is of common bond, painted on the front. Entrances occupy the first and fourth bays from the left. #517 has a glass over panels door topped by a boarded-over transom and now framed by a wide segmental arched architrave (over the original flat brick arch). The entrance to #519 is still in the original form with a glass over panels door topped by a one pane overlight and a flat brick arch. In the center of the front elevation is an enclosed passageway to the rear yards with a wooden bar-grill gate. All front windows are of 2/2 sash with flat brick arches and louvered shutters. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. Rear doors are paneled. The front roof is of a moderate slope, metal "A" frame with enclosed chimneys rising from the right walls. The attic of #519 is lighted by two small square, four pane windows in the right gable. The wing of #517 has a steep metal shed roof with several small enclosed chimneys. #519 is roofed by a moderate slope "A" frame covered with shingles. The front roofline has a simple boxed cornice with a row of dentils beveled on the ends. This building rests on a very low fieldstone foundation. There are small law areas to the rear.
