**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a three story brick building detached on the left side. It is approximately three bays square, joined to the rear by an older wooden building (not the shape of a log structure). This is of two stories with attic, two bays wide and six bays long, extending back along the left wall of the front section. The owner states that the front of this building was raised for the erection of the front three story section (brick). This rear section is covered by asbestos shingles on the left side and wood siding on the right side. There are balconies on the rear and right sides of this section. The front section is laid in common bond. The entrance, occupying the right bay, has a glass over panels door with a one pane overlight and a moulded transom bar. All front windows are of 1/1 sash with segment, two row header arches, as over the doorway. Rear area windows in the old section are very small 6/6 and 4/4 sash with louvered shutters. The front section metal roof slopes to the rear with an enclosed chimney rising midway above the left wall. The old section has a moderate slope metal "A" frame roof. "S" brace terminals tie the front section sidewalls together. The front cornice is boxed with a row of dentils topping the frieze. Three long brackets support this cornice and are carved with spheres, lozenges, and bear incised floral designs on the sides. These brackets are tied together at the bases by a narrow band of small lozenges. The building rests on a very low fieldstone foundation.
