DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a short, two story house, possibly of log construction because of its size and shape. It is detached on the right side and is three narrow bays wide and three long bays in depth with a two story "L" shaped wing, three bays long and one bay wide with a long side balcony. There is no brickwork, but the structure is covered on all exposed sides by an attractive dark red brick patterned asphalt siding. The entrance to #527 is in the center bay with a glass over panels door. #527A is entered by the right bay (second story apartment) and contains a glass over panels door with an overlight of four old panes. This is probably the original entrance when it was a one family house. In the left bay is a 1/1 sash window with paneled shutters. The three second story windows have 2/2 sash with louvered shutters. Rear area windows are now of 1/1 sash. Rear doors have four panels and no overlight. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear, and the wing has a slight slope shed roof, both of metal. A small enclosed chimney rises from the mid section of the right wall. The front cornice is boxed and trimmed by a row of dentils carved on the ends. The front facade is framed by vertical siding on the front corners. The building rests on a low foundation.
