DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story detached corner building of brick and is three bays wide and two bays in depth with a two story and attic three bay long wing. This wing joins the front section just below the ridge of the roof. This wing extends back along the side street, but has been extended by an angle on the left side to be broader than the front section. A two story, two bay extension joins this wing and is in turn extended by another two story, two bay long addition, making the total building six bays long. All brickwork is of common bond. The entrance to the Lunch Room occupies the right bay on the corner. To the left is a double shop window with large 2/2 sash and a plain mullion in the center. This appears to be quite old. Second floor front windows are now of 1/1 sash with wood lintels and sills. The top 1/2 story contains "eyebrow" windows just under the roofline and these also are present on the right side of the first wing. Other rear area windows are of 2/2 and 6/6 with wood lintels and sills. Rear and side doors are glass over panels with wood lintels. The roof of the front section is a rather steep "A" frame, the first wing has a steep metal shed roof, and the other extensions have moderate slope, metal "A" frame roofs. There are small chimneys at the end of each extension and enclosed in each gable of the front section. This attic is lighted by small four pane square windows on each end. The front roofline is boxed and probably conceals a two string brick cornice. The building rests on a low foundation.
