The two-story brick dwelling at 610 N. Market Street is located within the boundaries of the National Register Frederick Historic District. Built ca. 1875, the single-family dwelling is designed in an Italianate style characterized by an ornate, bracketed cornice, arched window and door openings with arched, brick keystone lintels. The building is a good example of the type of residential architecture that defines the Frederick Historic District and is considered a contributing resource.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached two story brick house, three small bays square with a two story four bay long wing, slightly recessed on the left side and a three bay long extension, also recessed. To the rear of this is a one story, cement block house. There is an enclosed balcony on the left side of the first wing. All brickwork is of common bond. The front entrance occupies the right bay and has a boarded over glass over panels door, a one pane transom, and a Victorian transom bar with varied cut motifs. Front windows are of 1/1 sash with brick segmental arches trimmed with keystones and end voussoirs of pink marble. The cornerstone on the left corner is also of pink marble. The arch over the front doorway is similar to the windows. Side windows of the front section wing are of 2/2 sash and the windows of the extension are of 6/6 sash, both with wood lintels and sills. Side doors are glass over panels with one pane transoms. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear and the wings have side sloping roofs--all of metal. The front cornice is similar in design to that of #606 with a triangular Victorian cornice decorated by rows of pierced "V's", crosses-saltire, mouldings, and supported by four decorative brackets. The frieze contains panels with incised scrolls. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
