DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick building containing two homes and detached on the left side. It is three bays wide and two bays in depth with a newer two story cement block "L" shaped wing being three bays square and with other extensions. The front brickwork is now covered by sheathing. An ordinary shop door with display windows occupies the two left bays and a glass paned door leading to the second floor occupies the right bay. Second floor front windows are now of 1/1 sash. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. A ~~two~~ string brick cornice supports the front and rear rooflines. The front section has a rather steep, metal "A" frame roof with small enclosed chimneys rising from the gables. This building rests on a rather high fieldstone foundation.

of exposed brick has been painted 'pea' green. The second story has a large, central bay window also painted pea-green, with dark-green trimming. Two doors, painted black and red, leading into the 609 property exist. They do not match and are in poor condition.

There is a brick window box on the street level directly underneath the large, central first floor window. The interior flooring in this section is wood, covered with linoleum with a small dirt basement underneath.

A concrete block alleyway on the northside of the property covers the original brickwork. This alleyway is open at the street, framed by a thin wooden archway, painted pea-green. A multi-colored corrugated fiberglass material covers this 28 foot alleyway.

Walking down the alleyway, one arrives at the large back section of the 611 property.** The north, interior wall of this area is painted brick; west wall - formed cement block; south wall - open to connect with the 609 property; and east wall - concrete block. The roofing in this area is inadequately supported, uninsulated, sheet metal. The flooring is a concrete slab.
