DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#6 is a large detached 2-1/2 story frame house, roughly three bays square, laid out in a Greek cross plan, and with many bays and projections such as a two story bay window section on the left and front and two similar bay sections on the right side. All bay sections support large steep sloped, overhanging pediments and are sheathed in shingles of at least six differing shapes. Other surfaces are sheathed by narrow Colonial style siding. This creates a very interesting roofline, centered by a pyramidal section topped by a chimney rising at the center. All roof sections are covered by slate. The rear section has a very plain facade and is capped by a steep sloped "A" frame roof.

The off-centered front entrance has a wide glass over panels door of the period. A wide wrap-around covered porch crosses the front and left sides of the house supported by turned pillars with very ornate, cut brackets including Victorian fans, turned spindles and dentils. All windows are of 1/1 sash and flat arched.

The house sets on a low foundation (fieldstone) and is sited amidst green lawns and large trees at the front and rear.

Building and is decorated by turned columns, scrolled brackets and turned balustrades at the cornice. The interior of the building, although converted to apartments many years ago has retained many queen anne features including oak mantel pieces with inset mirrors and shelving and colored tile hearths at the fireplace, a stained glass window at the stair landing on the first level pocket doors in the original parlor area and an open staircase to the second level. The third level of the building appears to have had use only as servants quarters and contains very few decorative features. The second level has been altered with the addition of apartments including the addition of paneling on some walls in the living room area and hallway.
