DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#16 is a large detached 2-1/2 story fieldstone and frame mansion approximately four bays square with a 2-1/2 story brick and frame "T" shaped wing being three bays wide and four bays in depth with a side gallery. A round, two story stone tower crowned by a bell-shaped roof with a globe finial, accents the house from the left (east) corner and a two story stone and frame bay window tower projects from the left side. The first story of the front section is of finely cut fieldstone with the first floor of the wing being brick laid in common bond. The upper story is sheathed with random length shingles. The front entrance occupies the second bay from the left with a wide natural finish door accented by a beautiful, leaded stained glass panel denoting a vase containing green branches and surrounded by geometric forms. The transom and left side window are also in leaded stained glass with floral designs. A very wide first floor, three part window is set in the two right bays. The round stone tower is lighted by sets of small paned casement windows with wood mullions. Above the first floor, three part window is a Palladian style, three part window trimmed by dentils. On the right side is another three part window and most have 1/1 sash with the Palladian having 2/2. First floor windows are headed by flat stone arches with wing windows having wood lintels and sills. The house is fronted by a wide stone porch bearing Doric columns and a cornice sheathed in gray asbestos shingles to blend with the stonework.

The roof of the front section and wing is hipped and covered by asphalt shingles. This roofline is pierced by peaked dormer windows with small paned casements on all sides. Three very wide brick chimneys, corbelled at the top, rise prominently from the second story level. The house sets back amid lawn areas and large trees.
