**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

#22 is a large detached 2-1/2 story frame house approximately three bays square with a 2-1/2 story frame "T" shaped wing approximately two bays square. There are rather shallow and wide, two story bay window sections in the right bay of the front and both sides. This house is now sheathed with natural-looking wood grained aluminum siding.

A rather plain period glass over panels door occupies the off-centered entrance-way. The house is fronted by a covered porch with Doric pillars, small brackets and turned banisters. The porch entrance is headed by a small pediment decorated with applied rosettes and foliage. All windows are of 1/1 sash.

The pyramidal roof of the front section is pierced by a square chimney surrounded by ballustrades of turned banisters forming a "widow's walk." A similar ballustrade fronts the shallow porch fronting the casement windows in the pediment topping the right front bay windows. Peaked dormers light the attic from the front and sides. This roof section extends beyond the walk and is "supported" by small brackets. A band of embossed metal in a foliated garland and ribbon design adorns the frieze. The wing has a steep sloped "A" frame roof and all is covered by asphalt shingles.

The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation and sets amid lawn areas, large trees, and there is a large vegetable garden to the rear.
