DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#104 is a 2-1/2 story detached brick house approximately four bays wide and five bays in depth with a 2-1/2 story frame extension being one bay deep and three bays wide with a left side gallery. There are many projections. A quaint, round shingled bay window crowned by a conical roof and metal finial extends from the right (west) corner of the second story. On the left front corner and both sides are two story brick bay window sections and a small triangular wooden bay window projects midway between the first and second stories on the right side to light a stairway and is decorated by dentils and small panels. All brickwork is of pressed brick laid in common bond and a brick belt course of alternately depressed vertical stretchers between bands of projecting stretchers crosses the front and sidewalls at the midpoint of first floor windows. The rear section is shingled.

A large, round arched entrance occupies the second bay from the left with period doors of glass over panels. A large, round arched double window lies to the right. All windows are of 1/1 sash with some on the first floor having transoms. Three round arched windows on the second floor front have drip moulds and the others have flat brick jack arches. A small, leaded, stained glass window, done in a floral motif, appears on the right side. A deep wrap-around porch fronts the right front section of the building and supports the round bay window at the corner. This porch has turned pillars, turned banisters, and a delicate spindle cornice. A large round gas lantern of brass and scribed glass lights the doorway from the side. The rear section side gallery is also adorned with turned pillars and spindle cornice, but with a Victorian-cut ballustrade. The pyramidal roof is enhanced by lower hipped sections above the bay windows, the conical roof of the tower, small peaked dormer windows with the infills bearing scrollwork and by tall and wide chimneys rising from the second story level. The mansion rests on a low fieldstone foundation and sets among lawn areas, evergreens and trees.
