DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#11 is a very tall detached three story brick and stone house approximately three bays square with a two story brick and stone "L" shaped wing two bays wide and four bays in depth with a side balcony. From sidewall and rearwall evidence, this was originally a 1-1/2 story stone house with a 1-1/2 story stone wing, but both were built up during Victorian times and a front brick facade in common bond added. The simple doorway with paneled enframing and rectangular transom occupy the left (W) bay. First floor front windows are of 1/1 sash with those above 6/6 sash and all have flat brick arches of long shaped voussoirs. There is a three part 6/6 sash with sidelights on the right side of the wing and other rear windows are of 6/6 sash, some with old narrow frames and all have wood lintels and sills. On the left side is a two story Victorian porch with ornate cut banisters on the second story. The front section had been built up to 2-1/2 stories with brick and had a moderate slope "A" frame roof. This was later built out to three stories by raising the front wall to the height of the ridge. The original wide enclosed chimney on the right side has been extended several times. The wing roof is now rather flat. The front overhanging cornice is of Victorian design with a band of  shaped motifs similar to houses in the 100 block of nearby S. Market Street. Channeled and concave curving brackets divide and end the bays. This building sets on a low fieldstone foundation.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The front facade of this building is poorly designed with small windows in big spaces and its height dwarfs its Federal neighbors. It is badly deteriorated inside and outside, but the walls seem to be very sturdy. Any restoration should include reducing it to either a 1-1/2 story house or 2-1/2 story house as it had been at one time.
