DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is now a two story house of brick, approximately three bays square with a two story "L" shaped wing to the rear of #15, one bay wide and two bays in depth with a side balcony. The front facade is laid in Flemish bond to the second story and with sidewall evidence, indications are that this was built as a 1-1/2 story house. Front entrances now occupy the end bays with a 1/1 sash window between and the right bay door replaces a former window. The entrances now have newer doors and segmental arched transoms but the original doorway at #15 has a paneled enframing and an ornamental cast iron porch. Second story front windows are of 6/6 sash with protruding two string brick segmental arches with the bottom row recessed and with centered "keystones" of long shaped voussoirs. Infills are decorated by centered roundels and this same decor is repeated above the window and doors of the first floor. Rear windows are also of 6/6 sash with 2/2 sash wing windows and all have wood lintels and sills.

The front section roof now slopes to the rear and the wing has a shed roof, all of metal. The front roofline is decorated by an overhanging cornice with dentil trim and Victorian moulded brackets divide and end the bays. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
