DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached pair of 2-1/2 story brick houses located on a corner, four bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with a 1-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing three bays wide, two in depth. All brickwork is in common bond. Simple front entrances occupy the outer bays with #102 retaining a four panel door and both having three pane overlights. Rear doors are also of four panels with three pane overlights. Front windows are of 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills with second story lintels being top moulded and trimmed with a band of scallops as on #104-110. Side and rear windows are of 6/6 sash except for 4+4 hinged "lie on your stomach" casement windows in the top sections. The attics are lighted by two four pane windows in each gable including the wing. The front section and wing have moderate slope "A" frame roofs both resting on two string brick cornices. Double flue enclosed chimneys rise at the ends of the front section and wing. This pair of houses sets on a rather high field-stone foundation.
