DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story row of three brick houses, detached on the right (W) side. #20 is two bays wide and the others are of three bays and all two bays in depth. #20 has a 2-1/2 story brick "L" shaped wing four bays deep and one bay wide with a side balcony. #22 and 24 share a 2-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing approximately four bays square with side balconies, and #24 has a one story brick extension. All brickwork is in common bond and of old soft brick. Simple front entrances occupy the left bay of #20 and center bays of the others. #20 and 24 retain four panel doors with #22 having a newer door. All have narrow overlights. Enclosed passageways to the rear yards occupy the left bay of #22 and the right bay of #24. Front windows of #20 & 24 are of 1/1 sash with #22 having 2/2 sash and all have moulded top lintels as above the doorways. #20 has louvered shutters and #22 now has a larger first floor window. Rear area windows are of 6/6 panes with old thin framing and #20 retains old hand blown glass. Kitchen doors are of four panels with three pane overlight. Wing attics are lighted by a four pane window on #20, a 4+4 casement window on #22 and a six pane sash on #24. The front section has a low slope "A" frame roof resting on a three string brick cornice on the front with the bottom row in dentils. There is a two string brick cornice on the rear. The attic area is continuous with no walls, and the metal roof covers old wood shingles. A double flue enclosed chimney rises on the side of #20 and the other houses share a large chimney with a small chimney on the right of #24. #20 has a steep shed wing roof and the "T" wing has a moderate slope "A" frame roof, all of metal. These houses rest on a low fieldstone foundation and #24 is fronted by a herringbone brick pavement.
