DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two story brick detached house, three bays wide and one bay deep with a two story "L" shaped wing, six bays long and one bay wide with a one bay square extension. A long balcony adjoins the wing. All brickwork is of painted common bond. The doorway occupies the left bay with a paneled door with rectangular overlight and framed by Doric pilasters and a flat entablature.

Front windows are of 1/1 sash and topped by molded lintels with dentil trim. A bay window is cantilevered above the front door, also decorated by dentils. Side and rear windows are 2/2 and 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills, and protected by both louvered and paneled shutters. Rear area doors are paneled and topped by overlights.

The front section roof is of composition material and slightly sloping while the wing has a metal shed roof. Two chimneys are enclosed in the left wing wall. The front roofline is edged by a decorative cornice with a "U" shaped motif similar to others in this area and supported on the rear by a two string brick cornice. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation. The rear and side yards are filled with debris and weeds but there are some very nice trees.

This house is one of the formerly spacious elegant Federal town houses in a fashionable neighborhood at the turn of the century. The "L" shaped plan of the building presents a fine potential for a private courtyard, dooryard patio and a landscaped flower yard with tall trees in the rear. The Potomac Edison Company has defaced the front wall with a new "circuit board" installation which should be redone properly.
