DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a tall brick and stone 2-1/2 story house detached on the left (W) side, four bays wide and approximately three bays in depth with a one story brick "L" shaped wing with a frame second story, 1-1/2 bays wide and four bays in depth with a side balcony. The front facade is of common bond brick, the exposed left wall is a combination of stone and brick and the rear wall is of solid fieldstone, 2' thick. Front entrances occupy the center bays with newer doors and paneled enframements. These are approached by porches of eight steps. All front windows are of 2/2 sash with the wood lintels and sills having end blocks decorated with roundels, as above the doors. There are full-sized, old six panel doors beneath the front porches and six pane vertical cellar windows, all with the same trim as above. A rear entrance to the front section has a newer door set in a heavy enframement with channeled decor and a three pane overlight. Wing windows are of old 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and there are three remaining old Colonial style shutters* with widely spaced thick louvers and fasteners. The attic is well lighted by two large 2/2 sash windows in the left gable and a peaked 6/6 dormer window centered above the #17 entrance. The front section has a broad, steep-sloped "A" frame roof resting on 3+2 string brick cornices with a pair of double flue chimneys joined by a curtain rising at the right gable and a wide enclosed four flue chimney on the left side. The wing has a shed roof and all are of metal. The house has a low fieldstone foundation on the front with high brick cellar walls, raising it mostly above ground. It is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement.
