This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached pair of houses four bays wide and three bays deep with a two story brick "T" shaped wing three bays wide and four bays in depth with side balconies. All brickwork is in common bond. Simple front entrances occupy the inner bays with four panel doors and narrow overlights. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with two row header brick segmental arches as above the doors. Rear windows have 6/6 sash with wood sills and lintels. The front section has an "A" frame roof resting on a two string brick cornice on the front and double flue enclosed chimneys rise on each end. The wing roof joins the front section and slopes to the rear. This building rests on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a brick pavement. On the left side of #148 is an old ornamental cast iron rainspout base about 3' high and imprinted with "*Henry Pample-Frederick Md.*" It is richly decorated in relief by panels, a crocket with a flower design, and foliage motifs.
