DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a tall, three story brick commercial building detached on the left side and is six bays wide and five bays in depth with a full width, two story section of the same width and depth. There is also a one story frame extension. All brickwork is in common bond with the front facade in a painted, small pressed brick. There are star brace terminals on the exposed left wall and the rear end corner is rounded for delivery vehicle purposes and corbelled out again at the second story level. This building had been used by "Harris & Filler" for many years as a wholesale merchant. The first floor front has been altered considerably by large window areas of smaller panes and two entrances, all topped by a broad signplate with a cornice. The upper part of the front facade remains the same in its rich Victorian decor. Vertical brick pilasters adorned with square bosses in a floral motif and sections of reeding, accent the corners and center of the building. In between are sections of three windows, round arched on the second story and segmental arched on the third story. These have white stone sills and arches with keystones and joined together at the impost blocks. Below each third story window is a terra cotta recessed panel in a moulded floral design. Capping the front roofline is a very ornamental metal cornice topped by twin protruding pediments tipped by acroteria, ornamented by a row of scallops and with pairs of segmented designs in the infills. Below those is a row of closely spaced brackets with round bosses in a floral pattern in between. The painted frieze is topped by a band of spheres and ended by a band of brick corbelled dentils. There are large bracket forms topped by blocks surmounted by spheres on either side and at the center. All rear and side windows are of 6/6 sash with two row header segmental arches. On the alley side is an old delivery entrance of double doors with tongue and groove boards in a diagonal pattern and the doorway enframingent is of heavy metal. All roofing is of metal and slopes to the rear. The building rests on a low foundation of fieldstone.
