

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three and one half story brick building detached on the left side, six narrow bays wide and five bays in depth with two story brick "U" shaped wings, two bays wide and three in depth with end balconies. The wing second stories were added at a later date. All brickwork is in common bond with #23 recently restored on the front. Entranceways occupy the first and fourth bays from the left with #23 retaining the original paneled double doors. These doorway have round arched transoms with dentiled transom bars and are headed by four row header brick arches with long brownstone keystones and impost blocks. These entrances are reached by marble sills and four step concrete porches with wrought iron railings. To the right of these are two bay wide, 1/1 sash windows with segmental arched transoms, keystones, and dentiled transom bars as over the entrances. Second story front windows are of round arched 1/1 sash with center windows higher and all topped by three row brick header arches. Third story front windows are also of 1/1 sash but with flat brick arches. The front facades are identical, with four string belt courses in a chain  design running across the top of the second story level and the third stories are topped by joined brick pediments with lunette windows, triangular top panels of raised scrollwork, and topped by tall metal finials. On either side at the pediment bases are short sections of dentiled cornice with ornate end brackets decorated by floral and scrolled bosses and with long, attached pendants of a spiral design. These pediments are attached to a slate covered mansard roof decorated by a band of fish scale shingles and floral and star designs. This is edged by mouldings with floral motif bosses at the ends. Rear are windows are of either wide, 2/2 sash or regular 6/6 sash and are topped by two row header segmental arches or have wood lintels and sills. There are four panel doors. The roof of the front section slopes toward the rear and the wings have metal shed roofs. The building rests on a high fieldstone foundation.
