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**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a tall, 2-1/2 story attached brick former home, four bays wide and two in depth with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, four bays long and 1-1/2 bays wide with a side balcony and a one story brick extension. There is also a one bay square second story frame extension. All brickwork is in common bond. The first floor front is occupied by an apartment entrance and two shop fronts of different designs. Both have large paned windows but with different enframements. #37 has pilasters with narrow bands of fluting and a cornice trimmed by dentils and fluting. #39 has reeded pilasters with diagonal reeded center sections and a moulded cornice with closely spaced cyrma curved brackets with incised sunbrust patterns in between. The apartment entrance on the right bay is very tall with double doors of panels topped by a round arched transom with a dentiled transom bar. This leads to a vestibule with a glass over panels door, an overlight, and a fluted door surround. A bay window occupies the second story left bay with segmental arched 1/1 sash windows and trimmed by fluted pilasters, dentils and panels. To the right are three 1/1 sash windows with two row header segmental arches and protected by segmental arched louvered shutters. Rear area windows are of 2/2 sash. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof and the wing has a shed roof with both of metal. The front roofline has a three string brick cornice with the center row in dentils. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
