**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story brick Federal style home detached on the alley side. It was later used as a funeral home and later as a beauty school. It is approximately three bays square with a full width brick two story extension of four bays and a newer two bay extension. Front brickwork is laid in painted Flemish bond and the left side reveals the color to be of a salmon shade. Rear and side brickwork is in common bond. The front entranceway occupies the right bay and has been completely altered by small pane, double doors and a Georgian surround with moulded pilasters with ears, crowned by a broken pediment decorated with dentils and an urn. The paneled door enframingent and five pane overlight may be original. Front and side windows are of 6/6 or 6/1 sash with flat brick arches and louvered shutters on the second story front, and these windows are shorter than on the first floor. The original wing has 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills. The attic is lighted by a 6/6 sash window with a flat brick arch in the left gable. The front section has a broad, steep, slope "A" frame roof resting on a three string brick cornice on the front and a pair of double flue enclosed chimneys joined by a curtain rises on the left gable. The wings have shed roofs and both are of metal. The front section and the original wing (funeral home) repose on a low fieldstone foundation. The house is fronted by a brick pavement in a herringbone pattern.
