DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story stone and brick building on a corner which is four bays wide and approximately eight bays long. The right side wall reveals an original 2-1/2 story brown fieldstone house, two bays in depth with a small attic window opening as used for 2/2 sash. To the rear of this had been added a one story gray fieldstone "L" shaped wing three bays long and two bays wide. Later, a one story brick extension of three bays long and two bays wide was added. The whole structure has been built up to three stories with side galleries and a one story side extension to the wings. All brickwork is in unpainted common bond. The first floor now has an attractive "Colonial" shop front with a center door of crossbuck style with small panes and a four pane overlight. On either side are attractive, small paned windows over panels. This is topped by a boxed cornice with a wooden frieze containing the signplate and which continues across the adjoining #102-104. Front windows are of 1/1 sash with wood lintels and sills and wing windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. There are glass over panel doors with overlights. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wings have shed roofing with all of metal. The front roofline is edged by a boxed moulded cornice with the frieze adorned by dentils and a band of lozenges and one of beading. This is supported by brackets having bosses with floral motifs. The building stands on a low foundation of fieldstone stretching to the end of the last wing.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

As mentioned above, a small fieldstone cottage became the base for a large Victorian apartment building with shops. The corner shop became a longtime landmark as W.W. Condon's Cigar and Tobacco Shop and the name remained painted on the front wall above the cornice until recently.
