DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick house detached on the right side and approximately three bays square with a two story brick "L" shaped wing five bays long and two bays wide with side and rear balconies and a one bay square two story extension. The front facade has a more recent facing of sand colored brick and all is in common bond. The front entranceway occupies the left bay with a four panel door, a rectangular transom, paneled enframing and surrounded by Doric pilasters with recessed panels and topped by a cornice of dentils with moulded brackets just below the second story bay window. This is of 1/1 sash as are all other front windows which have modern flat brick soldier course lintels and sills. The rear of the front section has old JIB window-doors on the first and second stories as does its neighbor at #121. The wing has 6/6 sash windows with wood lintels and sills. Doors either have four panels or glass over panels and overlights. The shed roof wing has two unusual, very wide shed roof dormers of numerous small sash. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof supported by a three string brick cornice on the rear, but the front roofline is covered by a boxed wooden cornice. A modern square enclosed chimney rises from the right gable. The front slope is of metal while the rear slope and the wing have asbestos shingle roof coverings. This house sets on a low fieldstone foundation. There is a long yard to the rear.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This old Federal house has lost all of its character of the front facade by modern alterations. The rear and side views are strictly Federal in appearance. The light colored brick facade and doorway heading detract from its appearance---A lesson in how to make an old attractive building into a modern, ugly one.
