DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a wide and tall three story brick attached building, three bays wide and three shorter bays in depth with a lower three story brick "L" shaped wing, two bays wide and four bays long, a two bay square, two story extension, and a one story, one bay square extension. A three story section of enclosed galleries extends 1/2 across the rear of the front section opposite the wing. All brickwork is in common bond. The tall front entrance occupies the left bay with a new glass and chrome storm door section leading to a spacious vestibule with a three part entrance including a glass over panels door, wide sidelights over panels, a six pane transom, and the transom bar and supporting pilaster capitals being decorated. This is approached by a four step, cast and wrought iron railing porch. The front window opposite the doorway has been altered to a wide three section style of aluminum framing with a metal lintel. Below this at the basement level, 1/2 below ground, is an office with a similar but smaller window. It has a glass over panels door which may be original and is topped by a flat brick arch. The stairwell is enclosed by wrought iron railings. Upper story windows are of 6/6 with flat brick arches. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash or 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills and doors are of four panels and board and batten type. The front roof slopes to the rear with stepped side walls and the wing has a shed roof with both of metal. A rear garden has a stone walk, boxwood and shrub plantings. The house sets on a rather high foundation. The pavement is laid in a brick herringbone pattern. The front roof line has a classic styled cornice with moulding, projecting over scrolled modillions, large dentils and indented  mouldings over a raised brick frieze.
