**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story brick detached house approximately three bays square with a two story brick "L" shaped wing six bay long and two bays wide with a side balcony and a two story, one bay square extension. All brickwork is of common bond and the front has recently been restored revealing old salmon colored brickwork. The front entranceway occupies the left bay with double doors of panels, a one pane transom with a moulded transom bar, paneled enframing and the whole framed by Doric pilasters with indented panels and a rather plain, flat entablature overall. This is approached by a three step granite porch with wrought iron railings. First floor windows are of 2/2 sash and those above are of 6/6 sash all with thin, flat brick arches. Rear area windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. There are several four panel doors with two pane overlights. The wing area has a brick patio and a rear lawn area with a brick dependency with a board and batten door with scrolled louvers. The attic is lighted by 6/6 sash in each gable. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with two double flue chimneys joined by a curtain enclosed in the right wall and an enclosed, very thin, wide, chimney rising from the left gable. The wing has a shed roof and both are of metal. The front roofline has a small moulded colonial style cornice instead of the usual corbelled brick construction usually found on earlier Federal homes. This building sets on a low foundation. The side gateway has a balustraded top section.
