**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a two story brick detached corner home, three bays wide and approximately four bays in depth with an "L" shaped brick, two story wing, four bays long and two bays wide with side and rear balconies and a one story newer extension. All brickwork is in common bond with the front and right side recently restored. The front entrance occupies the left bay with wide double doors of glass with dentil trim and a round arched transom supported by a transom bar moulded in a floral design. This is topped by a three row header brick arch and a one row header hood mold. This bay projects slightly from those on the right and the door is approached by a four step, cast concrete or limestone porch with wrought iron railings. This leads to a spacious vestibule with a glass over panels door with moulded framing separating it from wide sidelights over panels and the three part overlight. All sashes have a row of dentils beneath. There is a wide window of small panes and a flat arch of newer construction to the right. Above the doorway is a bow window, unusual for Frederick, with 1/1 sash, a dentiled cornice, and panels. Remaining second story front windows are of 1/1 sash with top sash edged by small panes and with arches similar to above the door. Side and wing windows are of 2/2 sash with two row header segmental brick arches and louvered shutters. There is a rear four panel door with a three pane overlight. The front facade has a decorative three string "watertable" and a two string belt course beneath second story windows. This is topped by a pediment over the left bay and joined by a one slope mansard roof containing a small dormer with double windows of 2/2 sash. These features all lie above a moulded cornice. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a very low "A" frame roof with both of metal. The building rests on a rather low foundation of fieldstone. To the rear is a flower garden.
