DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story late Victorian townhouse detached on the right side. It is three bays wide and approximately four bays long with a two story brick "L" shaped wing, five bays long and two ~~bays~~ wide with a side balcony and a two story brick one bay square extension. ~~There~~ is also a 1/2 bay brick extension to the front section beside the wing. All brickwork is of common bond with the front facade faced with a deep red pressed brick. The front entranceway occupies the right bay with double paneled doors with the lower panels containing a large floral design carved in relief. Above this is a round arched transom with a moulded transom bar. This leads to a large vestibule with double doors, the lower panels carved like those in front and the top section with richly engraved glass panels. In the ceiling is a moulded plaster relief holding the light fixture. The vestibule inside transom is round arched and the transom bar is trimmed like that on the front. This is approached by a two step marble porch and door sill and a wrought iron railing. A potted yew is placed to the left of the porch. First floor windows are of 1/1 sash with round arches of long, thin voussoirs as over the doorway. Wrought iron box grills containing planters of low evergreens are attached to these windows. The window treatments of the second and third story fronts are identical with a two story section bay window of 1/1 sash, trimmed by dentils and panels in the right bay over the doorway. Those on the left are of 2/2 sash with segmental arches of long, thin voussoirs. All front windows have granite sills. Wing windows are of 2/2 sash with flat brick arches. The doors have glass over panels and the rear extension has two four panel doors side by side, probably leading to an early dependency. The front section roof slopes to the rear with stepped sidewalls with wide, enclosed chimneys, and the wing has a shed roof with both of metal. The front roofline is decorated by a richly carved Victorian cornice with rows of projecting floral designs, attached pointed pendants, a band of quatrefoils, and a moulded bar incised with vertical openings on the frieze. Moulded brackets divide the bays. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation. To the right of the wing is a landscaped courtyard with a planting of various hollies and evergreens and backed by an old cast iron fence.
