**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a large 2-1/2 story brick house detached on the right side and approximately four bays square with a two story brick "L" shaped wing approximately four bays deep and two bays wide with side galleries on both floors. All brickwork is of recently restored common bond. The area around the first floor front windows had been altered to a wide colonial style window of small panes but has been changed back to two windows of 12/12 sash. There are "S" end plates for building braces on the right wall. The front entranceway occupies the right bay and is very attractive with a newer three part doorway consisting of a six panel door, sidelight over panels, paneled enframements, and a seven sash overlight. Crowning this is a moulded broken pediment with an urn. A colonial lamp lights the way. Windows on the second floor front are of 9/6 sash and all have moulded wood lintels and louvered shutters. Rear area windows are all 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills and protected by louvered shutters. There are four paneled doors with overlights. The attic is lighted from the right gable by two large 2/2 sash windows. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with simple boxed cornices on the front and rear and the wing has a shed roof and both are of metal. Double flue enclosed chimneys rise from each gable. The low fieldstone foundation is faced with granite on the front, and there is also a low granite porch. There is an attractive rear yard. From a 1973 survey, a three string brick cornice was visible at the front roofline.
