## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a three story brick attached building three bays wide and two bays deep with a full width first floor extension of approximately two bays in depth and a two story, one bay wide, two bay long "L" shaped wing. The front facade is of a painted hard finished pressed brick with rear areas being of regular brick, all in common bond. The rebuilt entranceway to the apartments is in the right bay and is very attractive with a recessed red colonial style door of small panes over panels and the open vestibule is fronted by plain pilasters holding large colonial torch lamps. Left bays are occupied by a modern shop front with central door and large paned windows, however, an attractive sign of white vertical wood paneling and "Colonial Jewelers" in Roman lettering crosses the building creating a unit of the entrances and windows. Upper story front and rear windows are of 6/6 sash. Those on the front are headed by Victorian cornices with end brackets and decorated by horseshoe shaped crescents and with wood sills. Rear windows have mostly flat brick arches and sills. The metal roof of the front section slopes to the rear with an enclosed chimney on the left side and the wing has a rather flat roof. The front roof cornice is of simple moulded construction with modillions decorated with bosses in a rose motif. There is a raised brick frieze crossed by a moulded bar. This building rests on a low foundation.
