DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a very large brick, three story building detached on the right side. It is five bays wide and approximately three in depth. The three story "L" shaped wing is two bays wide and five bays in length with a side balcony on the second floor and has several small extensions. Front brickwork is laid in Flemish bond while that of the sides and rear is in common bond. The front center bay is occupied by a large Federal style doorway with paneled pilasters and a flat entablature supported by brackets richly carved with acanthus leaves. This is approached by a marble stoop with cast iron railings and leads to a deep vestibule with a double door entrance. The adjoining shop windows have large panes with small sash transoms. The upper story windows of 6/6 sash are crowned by moulded lintels with a rope or cable motif as used on the second story of #108. Rear and side windows have 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The roof of the front section slopes to the rear and the wing roof to the side with both being of metal. The front roof cornice protrudes and is supported by large carved brackets on a raised frieze as on #108. These brackets are trimmed with floral bosses and endings and pendants. The building rests on a rather low fieldstone foundation, and it is fronted by a brick walk laid in herring-bone pattern. There is no evidence of the raising of the 2-1/2 story building to three stories on the exposed sidewall, as described in historic records. A new sidewall must have been added. Also, remains of a former watertable of Georgian times is visible.


