## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a low, 2-1/2 story brick combination house and shop, now detached on the left side. It is three bays wide and approximately four bays in depth, and the side-walls are at an angle to accommodate the curve of the street. To the rear is an "L" shaped, two story brick wing, three bays long and one bay wide and also a newer three bay wide cement block extension. All brickwork is in common bond. The first floor front contains two identical doorways in the right bays and an old shop bay window with a protruding cornice and dentil trim. The right bay doorway leads to living quarters to the rear and on the second floor. Both doors are paneled and with scribed panels on the side frames. On the second floor front are three small windows formerly holding 6/6 sash with wood lintels and endblocks carved with roundels. The attic is lighted by two old wooden dormers on the left side. Rear area windows are of either 6/6 or 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof while the wing has a rather flat roof--both of metal. The rooflines have very simple wooden moulded cornices. A small chimney is enclosed in the left gable. This building rests on a street level foundation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This is a small landmark building of the "bend" of W. Patrick Street dating back nearly two centuries and eventhough small, it is picturesque and possessing one of the very few remaining old wooden shop bay windows. During the first half of this century, it had been a family battery manufacturing and sales shop, owned by Mr. Fisher who lived with his family in the same building.
