

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#203 is a tall, three story brick house detached on the left side, three bays square with a two story brick "L" shaped wing six bays long and two bays wide with a one bay square frame extension and side galleries supported by Doric columns with the top section enclosed. All brickwork is in common bond and the front is faced with painted pressed brick. The front entrance occupies the right bay and is of Victorian design with double doors of glass over panels leading to a wide vestibule. Above is a round arched transom and a dentiled transom bar. This is all framed by a paneled enframingent and pilasters with mouldings in a panel and roundel design. Above is a very ornate overhanging cornice section trimmed with bands of rounded dentils, tapered blocks with incised quatrefoils, incised scrollwork on the spandrells and end brackets with incised foliage designs. This doorway is approached by a low granite stoop with rounded sidewalls. All front windows are of segmental arched 1/1 sash with heavy cornices repeating the doorway design and first floor windows are taller. An ornate bay window protrudes from the left side ornamented with large dentils and ornate fluted brackets. It is ended by an ornamental, tapered section. Rear area windows are also of 1/1 sash with wood lintels and sills. The front roof slopes to the rear with stepped sidewalls and the wing roof is rather flat. The overhanging Victorian cornice is decorated with bands of dentils and other incised motifs and moulded modillions. The bays are divided and end by concave moulded brackets bearing tall acanthus leaf designs, and these divide a band of incised panels. The frieze is ended by a band of chevrons. The building sets on a low foundation and is fronted by a herringbond design brick pavement.
