DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This late Federal pair of 2-1/2 story brick attached houses is five bays wide and two bays in depth with two story brick "U" shaped wings, two bays long and one bay wide with an enclosed balcony on the rear of #148. All brickwork is in common bond. Entranceways occupy the end bays and are segmentally arched and with doors of four panels with one pane transoms and moulded transom bars. There is a segmental arched passageway in the center bay leading to the rear yards. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash with segmental brick arches. #146 has louvered shutters. The rear of the front section has narrow 4/4 sash in the center bays and the wings have 6/6 sash, all with wood lintels and sills. Rear doors have glass over panels. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with a central chimney, and there is a small peaked dormer on the rear of #146. This roof is supported by brick, two string cornices on the front and rear. The wings have shed roofs and all are of metal. The houses rest on a rather high foundation and are fronted by brick herringbone pattern pavements.
