

and four bays deep. Originally a two story open porch extended along the east side of the building, which over the years has been enclosed in the rear portion for bathroom use. A one story rear entrance porch with shed roof added recently is located across the rear of the building. The main entrance, twin single lighted doors with lower panel, recessed paneled entrance, one light transom, and wood lintel with bull's eye corner blocks approached by a replaced cement porch stoop and wrought iron railing is located in the first bay from the west end of the building. Located in the remaining bays are double hung replaced one over one windows with wood lintels with bull's eye corner blocks. A stepped brick cornice is located beneath the standing seam tin gable roof. Located on the remainder of the building are a variety of window types primarily double hung 6/1 and 6/6 sash. The building rests on a rubble limestone foundation. The rear of the building is covered by a standing seam shed roof.



A non contributing gable roofed cinder block garage, c. 1950 is located to the rear of the structure.

The interior of the structure is laid out in a side hall plan. Unfortunately, the building underwent substantial alterations c. 1900 of which an oak staircase, and interior molding and corner blocks around the front entrance remain. All that remains from the earliest Federal interior is a mantel piece located on the second floor front. The remainder of the building has undergone non-sympathetic alterations which included dropped ceilings, plywood paneling and exposure of bricks.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a tall 2-1/2 story brick house detached on the right side. It is two short bays wide and two long bays in depth with an "L" shaped, two story brick wing two bays wide and four bays in depth with the last two possibly added at a later date. The first two wing bays have a side balcony. Brickwork on the front is laid in Flemish bond while other work is in common bond. An entranceway occupies the left bay and now contains a pair of double glass panel doors. Front and side windows are now of 1/1 sash with wood lintels with square end blocks carved with roundels, as over the doorway. Rear windows are either of 6/6 or 6/1 sash with wood lintels and sills. The attic is lighted by a small window on the exposed side. The front section has a steep "A" frame roof with an enclosed chimney rising from the right gable and front and rear rooflines are supported by three string brick cornices. The wing has a shed roof and both are of metal. The building rests on a rather high fieldstone foundation.
