DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick house detached on the left side and is four bays wide and two bays in depth with an "L" shaped two story wing two bays wide and four bays long. It has side and rear balconies on the first and second floors and the basement is at ground level because of the nearby creek, infamous for flooding. The wing is angled from the front section to conform to property lines in this section of the 100 block. The entranceway occupies the third bay from the left and is early Federal in design with a six panel door, paneled enframing, and topped by a four pane overlight and wood lintel. This is approached by a three step wooden stoop with turned ballusters and a side entrance and with a well-worn stone door sill. All windows on the front section are of 6/6 sash with plain wood lintels (formerly with square end blocks and roundels). Wing windows have 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills and louvered shutters. Rear doors are glass over panels and with overlights. The attic is lighted by small four pane windows on either gable. The front section has a rather low slope "A" frame roof covered by wooden shingles (unusual^{now} for Frederick's older section) and there are small enclosed chimneys on either gable; however, the one on the left is just to the rear of the peak or ridgeline (also unusual). This roof is supported by two string brick cornices on the front and rear. The wing has a rather flat metal roof. The house rests on a high fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a brick herringbone pattern pavement. All brickwork is of common bond.
