DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick building (#203) with an extension (#201) built around 1925. The extension is of two stories and built to the right on the east side, making it a corner property. The whole is now six bays wide and approximately four bays in depth with #203 having a 2-1/2 story "L" shaped wing two bays wide and three bays long with a side balcony and #201 having a two story, two bay wide, one bay deep wing with a rear balcony and a one story, two bay long, one bay wide extension along the side street (Bentz St.). This has a small shop window and entrance similar to the front. The first floor front has large paned shop windows and an entrance in the center with an entrance to the apartments at #203 with double glass doors and a newer style four pane transom. A boxed cornice with dentil trim forms a unit of the first floor windows and doors. The second floor front contains bay windows with panels and dentil trim on the angled right corner and on the left bay. Other front windows are also of 1/1 sash with flat brick arches. The facade brickwork of #203 is laid in Flemish bond while the newer extension, #201, and other areas are in common bond. This entire facade is capped by a flat parapet, but an "A" frame roof of moderate slope on #203, running parallel with the street, rises behind it with a wide enclosed chimney in the left gable. Rear windows are mostly of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The roof of #201 slopes to the rear and all roofing is of metal. Below the front parapet is an overhanging modillioned cornice with the frieze being topped by a row of dentils and ended by a moulded band. The building rests on a rather high fieldstone foundation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The building is of no special architectural merit except that it is a good stabilizer for the corner intersection forming an "L" shaped wall, and the fact that it blends fairly well with its older neighbors. The only obvious indication of age is the hard to see "A" roof and the painted-over Flemish bond, which is also hard to see.

This building was remodelled in 1975 with a colonial style first floor facade and many other improvements.
