DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story brick attached building being five bays wide and two bays in depth with an "L" shaped 2-1/2 story brick wing, two bays wide and six bays long with rear and side balconies and a one story, one bay square extension. The wing is set at an angle to the front section, conforming to lot lines of the area because of a nearby angled crosstreet. All brickwork is in common bond. The original entrance-way occupies the center bay with a glass paneled door, paneled enframement, and a one pane overlight with a moulded transom bar. This is approached by a three step brick porch with an old sandstone sill and a wrought iron railing. There are newer wide multisash shop windows on either side with metal lintels and an apartment entrance door in the right bay similar to the main door, but with no side paneling and with a three pane transom. Upper story front windows are of 6/6 sash with wood lintels and with end blocks trimmed by grooved roundels, probably a poor reproduction of the originals. Rear windows are also of 6/6 sash and with plain lintels and sills. There is a rear paneled door with an overlight. The front section attic is lighted by two small windows in the left gable and for the wing, there is a 6/6 sash in the end. Both metal "A" frame roofs are of moderate slope, and at least the front roofline is supported by a three string brick cornice. The building has a low foundation. The end gables of the front section have enclosed chimneys.
