**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a 2-1/2 story brick attached building which is five bays wide and approximately two bays in depth with an added bay to the left conforming to the main section, but triangular shaped because the building to its left sets at an angle. There are two story brick "U" shaped wings with #209 being one bay wide and two bays deep and #211 setting at an angle toward it and being two bays wide by four bays in depth and with both having side balconies. The front facade is laid in a painted Flemish bond with a moulded watertable, but no indication of the usual three brick belt course of that period. All other brickwork is of common bond. Entranceways are in the second and third bays from the right with the original being in the third central bay of #211. It has a wide door with glass over panels, paneled enframement, four pane overlight, moulded transom bar, and a time-worn sandstone sill. #209 has a later, more simple and smaller glass over panels door with a one pane transom and a marble sill. #211 has two narrow 2/1 sash windows and #209 has a wide 1/2 sash on the first floor. The second floor front has 6/6 sash with flat jack arches as below. Rear area wing windows are either 6/6 or 2/2 sash with wood lintels and sills. The wing of #211 has a paneled door with a four pane overlight, but #209 has smaller doors. The roof of the front section has a rather steep slope "A" frame shape with a wide enclosed chimney on the left gable and indications of another having been on the right gable. There is a smaller chimney on the wings which have metal shed roofs. The front section does not have the usual small paned windows lighting the attic. There are wooden boxed cornices on the front and rear rooflines of the front section. The building rests on a high fieldstone foundation. #213, the added left bay, contains no watertable, has newer windows but an old appearing door, and is now used as a one room barbershop.
